Good Afternoon North East Family,

Please be advised that the District Office continues to maintain a COVID-19 dashboard on the nesd1.org website that parents can access for real-time information on the number of active on-campus and active off-campus cases. An on-campus case is one in which an individual was in school during his or her infectious period. An off-campus case is one in which the individual was not in school during his or her infectious period. All close contacts were notified.

During the weeks of May 22 and May 29, 2022, we received notifications of the following cases:

- 5 Davis students tested positive for COVID-19. These students are considered on-campus cases.
- 2 Davis students tested positive for COVID-19. These students are considered off-campus cases.
- 3 Intermediate students tested positive for COVID-19. These students are considered on-campus cases.
- 2 Intermediate students tested positive for COVID-19. These students are considered off-campus cases.
- 2 Middle School students tested positive for COVID-19. These students are considered on-campus cases.
- 6 High School students tested positive for COVID-19. These students are considered on-campus cases.
- 6 District employees tested positive for COVID-19. These cases are considered on-campus cases.
- 1 District employee tested positive for COVID-19. This case is considered an off-campus case.

The health and safety of our students and staff is our number one priority. We ask that if you believe you have been in contact with anyone who may have symptoms of COVID-19 or you experience COVID symptoms, to please stay home and contact your health care provider. Symptoms of COVID-19 can occur 2-14 days after exposure. This list does not include all of the symptoms (CDC, 2021).
